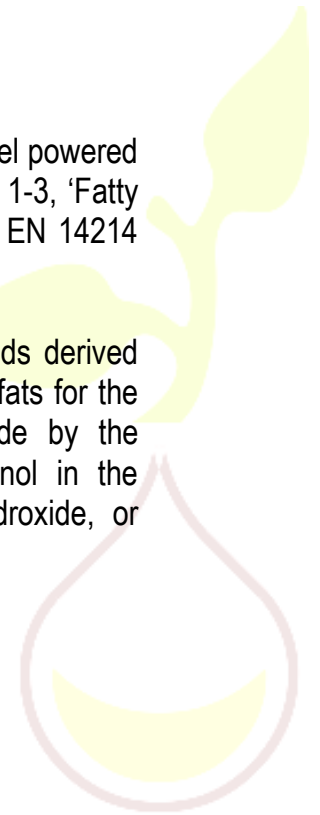

Fuels containing no more than 5% Biodiesel may be used in Ford diesel powered vehicles. Consistent with World Wide Fuel Charter (WWFC) category 1-3, 'Fatty Acid Methyl Esters (FAME) used in commercial fuel must meet both EN 14214 and ASTM D6751 specifications'

Biodiesel is defined as the mono alkyl esters of long chain fatty acids derived from renewable liquid feedstocks, such as vegetable oils and animal fats for the use in diesel engines. The most common Biodiesel fuel is made by the transesterification of soy or rapeseed triacylglycerides with methanol in the presence of a catalyst such as sodium hydroxide, potassium hydroxide, or sodium hydroxide.
