

# BIODIESEL TESTIMONIAL

OTTAWA CITY, CANADA

Starting May 1st, 50 public transit buses will be fuelled with Biodiesel as part of the City's ongoing efforts to cut greenhouse gas emissions (GHGs) and to reduce dependence on non-renewable fossil fuels. The City will use a Biodiesel blend of 5% soy and 95% petroleum diesel. This product reduces emissions of hydrocarbons, carbon monoxide and particulate matter.

"In October 2007, another 189 buses will be powered with this renewable and environmentally friendly fuel," said Councillor Peggy Feltmate, Vice-Chair of the City's Planning and Environment Committee, at Ottawa's annual Eco-Stewardship Fair.

"By September 2008, our entire bus fleet will run on Biodiesel and reduce overall greenhouse gas emissions by 4,000 tonnes a year. When the entire fleet of buses is powered by Biodiesel, it will be equivalent to taking over 1,000 cars off the road annually," added Councillor Feltmate. "This means our air will be cleaner and we will all breathe a little easier."
